

COVID-19 RISK ASSESSMENT

SUMMARY JUNE 2020

In line with government guidance, this document summarise the Risk Assessment that has been carried out by the Academy in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Academy has followed Government of Jersey Risk Assessment policy guidelines.

Summary of the Overall Risk Assessment in the COVID-19 Environment

- The Academy is reviewing government advice daily and will plan and adapt to ensure that we follow guidelines wherever possible.
- Procedures are in place to allow teachers and students to arrive and leave from the building, and to move around the building, safely.
- All teachers are to be briefed on correct Social Distancing (SD) and other hygiene rules prior to on-site teaching recommencing.
- Students and teachers on site will continue to be briefed on SD and hygiene rules to ensure compliance.
- Enhanced cleaning routines will be implemented throughout the building daily, with contact points in teaching rooms being wiped between each student.
